

A letter from our Board Chair

Dear Friends,

2022 was a steady, continuously improving year for our Chapel activities. Thanks to the generous support of our community, we had a strong year financially. With increased fundraising capacity and stronger communication systems, donation support held strong, despite a harsh economic environment.

We have continued to re-invigorate programming as we migrate to stand-alone, financial models coupled with targeted fundraising. The trend is good! Connect! is the star (as are its co-leaders, Elaine Bonds and Mimi Hauenstein). They are now a separate entity in partnership with Aspen Elementary School and serving twice the number of kids and growing. The Art Gallery and Sunday School are raising new monies to support their programming, and we are in the midst of reviving both Aspen Noise and Susan Nicholson's music events.

In '22, our streaming star, Matt Windholz, repackaged Nicholas' messages into podcasts and rebuilt the entire AV streaming rig which was first used on January 1, 2023.

The zoomification of society has hit the in-person attendance of all faith organizations. But, Chapel attendance continued to rebound in '22 with maximum attendance for our Lessons and Carols and Christmas services – welcoming hundreds of people to the Chapel. The Chapel's digital reach continues to grow, and our upcoming Wisdom from the Top of the World Speaker Series will demonstrate our expanded tandem program with both online and in-person opportunities.

Our community runs substantially on volunteers – time, talent, and treasure. So, big thanks to all who generously gave one or more of those ingredients in '22. We can always use more! If you would like to help fulfill our vision and mission, please be in touch.

Dear Friends,


2022 has been about building back our congregation after the ravages of covid and everything that went with it. Our main strategy has been to create new and interesting offerings that draw people in and develop their spirituality.


To that end we have been re-imagined our Sunday services as a series of 'courses' and launched a new initiative on Thursdays, in conjunction with our partners 'Lead with Love', called 'Thursday Satsang' (sacred gathering).

Heather Vesey has resumed joining me for Sunday services, and the courses included the series on The 10 Ox herding Pictures' and 'The Coming of the Cosmic Christ'.









We had a highly successful Christmas with about 500 people attending on Christmas Eve. At the beginning of the year, we were getting about 20 people on a Sunday and this moved up to 50 by the end of the year. Streaming has remained constant at around 200.

The Thursday Satsang began in September and around 25 people turned up each week. Lead with Love has re-committed to this semester, and we began again on February 9th.In 2023 we will continue with our courses, the next one being on 'Pilgrimage', which began on January 29th.

We are also launching a new brand 'Wisdom from the Top of the World' and using that to instigate a Speaker program to appeal to a wide audience.

James Finley is well known, and has been here before. Christian Dillo is a Zen Master and will appeal to the non-Christian part of our community. Bill Redfield works with Heather and is a successful podcaster. And Cyprian Consiglio is Prior of a community in Big Sur, and well known in Christian Contemplative circles.

In 2023 we are looking forward to building on what we achieved in 2022 and developing a reputation for 'authentic spirituality' that even more people will want to be a part of.



The Modern Mystics are Coming This Spring to the Aspen Chapel

The English author Evelyn Underhill says "Mysticism is the art of union with reality. The mystic is a person who has attained that union in a greater or lesser degree; or who aims at and believes in such attainment."

Mystics have emerged from every spiritual tradition as they seek past the normal rituals and liturgy that they may have been born into. Modern mystics have the advantage of blending traditional, faith wisdom with modern psychology and neurotheology. For example both James Finley and Bill Redfield are also therapists. **Four modern-day wisemen will grace the sanctuary at the Aspen Chapel.** In chronological order, they are:

James Finley, March 4-5 (a Thomas Merton – of the Trappist Monks – disciple)

Christian Dillo, March 18-19 (a Zen master - plus)

Bill Redfield, April 22-23 (an Episcopal priest who shifted into spiritual psychology)

Cyprian Consiglio, May 13-14 (a Christian monk, musician, composer, writer and teacher)
